School Development Plan – Actions

Learning Excellence Actions

- Use the Reading Assessment Decision Tree to guide next steps
- Daily UFLI and Heggerty lessons to improve decoding skills
- Follow clear scope and sequence
- Connect decodable text to concepts that are taught
- Embed routines and games
- Strategically teach high-frequency words (heart words)
- Build, model, and use sound walls and/or mnemonic alphabet
- Use a gradual release of responsibility





School Development Plan – Actions

Well-Being Actions

- Provide multiple opportunities to practice and consolidate skills
- Offer opportunities to blend and segment at students' just right level as identified in the provincial and school-based assessments
- Utilize flexible groupings for specific learning needs
- Clearly display learning expectations for all learners
- Use clear and consistent routines

School Development Plan

Structures and Processes

Classroom:

- Monthly review of attendance data
- Use of manipulates like small whiteboards, mirrors, letter tiles, magnet, sand, playdough
- Utilize routines and games: word ladders, matrices, puzzles, word sorts
- Consolidate with literacy centres
- Sound walls
- Learning circle check every 6 weeks to ensure student progress
- Re-grouping students' reading groups every 6 weeks

School Development Plan – Actions

Learning Excellence Actions

- Work with students to develop structures to support connectedness between classes, grades, programs.
- Family Literacy & Math night to showcase literacy and numeracy learning at school and how to support it at home.
- Ensure all students always have access to manipulatives readily accessible at their working spaces.
- Work with students to provide opportunities for student advocacy and engagements (talk time, feedback circles)
- Utilize texts that highlight the concept of 'belonging'





School Development Plan – Actions

Well-Being Actions

- Collaboratively address the identified areas of focus to create welcoming, caring, respectful and safe social and physical spaces (e.g., choose inclusive text sets, create posters/visuals encouraging inclusive spaces, utilize circle to build trust, address unsafe and identify safe places on school property etc.)
- Advertise, encourage and support students to engage in and/or access available clubs and safe spaces throughout the school year.
- Collaborate with students to reflect on personal values and beliefs and identify and celebrate a variety of cultures and diverse individuals throughout the year in respectful and appropriate ways in the classroom
- Ensure that extracurricular activities and clubs are welcoming and inclusive of students from diverse backgrounds, interests, experiences, and identities
- Invite guest speakers, community partners, or presenters and artists from various cultural backgrounds throughout the year.
- Teaching in the outdoors classroom
- Classroom Champions
- ROARS awards, monthly





School Development Plan – Actions

Truth & Reconciliation, Diversity and Inclusion Actions

- Engage in whole school planning to develop robust Extended Programs including professional learning (e.g., clubs, safespace offerings, inclusive coaching, etc.) that are based on student feedback and encompass diverse student skills and interests
- Students can visibly see their culture reflected within the school on the walls, books, through art projects, days of significance
- Students experience a wide variety of choice inside the building for extracurricular activities (Leadership Club, Garden Club, Music Club, Cosmetology Club; Boxing Club? Robotics Club; Coding Club; Lego Club; Hockey Club;
- Elders visiting the school connecting students to their Spirit-To Be and their Heart-To Belong (IEHLLF)

- Our school received \$2,682,123.00 in 2024-25 to provide a quality education to our students and meet the goals in our school development plan (SDP).
- At least 75 per cent of budgeted funds covers staffing and the remaining portion covers instructional and operational supplies.


